Food Insecurity and Pregnancy: Addressing Inequities through "Food is Medicine" Initiatives

Women are disproportionately affected by food insecurity, and these disparities are even more pronounced during pregnancy, with some studies estimating that one in five pregnant people face food insecurity. Federal and state programs that center “food as medicine” show promise in addressing the negative health outcomes that can result from food insecurity, improving both maternal and child health outcomes.

Legality of Syringe Services Programs in Maryland

Infections among people who use drugs related to lack of access to new syringes and subsequent syringe sharing have increased dramatically. Providing access to sterile syringes through syringe services programs (SSPs) is an extremely effective strategy for

reducing the spread of bloodborne disease among people who use drugs, their partners, and their families. This factsheet discusses the legality of SSPs in Maryland.
